This will be funding related to the Public Health Workforce. Ø

- Provider
- Covid remains to be an issue in the SLV but there is a lesser focus on Covid
- Reporting new cases have changed.
- State Board of Health has determined that only hospitalized cases will be reported.
- Focus will move to outbreaks at congregative facilities like jails, assisted living and schools.
- Vaccine bus will remain funded until the end of March.
- Boosters have slowed down and Public Health hasn't issued a booster for several months
- Possible undetermined case of Monkey Pox in Conejos County.
