November 17, 2021, CDPHE gave a surprise Vaccine Compliance Audit was conducted, the audit went well, no issues to report and Public Health passed the audit. CDPHE looked at vaccine storage, handling and documentation and Anna Raye Smith and Samantha Escobedo handled this portion of the Audit.

Samantha discussed that the only major find is that Public Health was out of stock of Baby and some of the rare vaccines, we as a county do not give out many of those vaccines and we were having inventory expire on us, so Public Health stopped ordering these vaccines. CDPHE encouraged Samantha to once again order and keep on hand.


