## Public Health-Core Public Health Services

## A. Administration and Governance

All public nealm agencies are required to establish and maintain programs, personnel, facilities, information technology and other resources necessary to deliver core qualic health services in the agency's jurisdiction.

#### B. Assessment Planning and Communication

1. Conejos County Specific Goal:

Work with community partners on existing and emerging local projects to influence health behaviors and conditions and advocate for family support systems that strengthen protective factors and reduce risk factors for children and families.

#### C. Communicable Disease Prevention, Investigation and Control

All public nearm agencies are required to track the incidence and distribution of disease in the population and prevent and control vaccine-preventable diseases, zoonatic, vector, alreadine, water-pointe, and food-dome Wilesses, and other diseases that are transmitted person-to-person.

#### G. Vital Records and Statistics

At agencies are required to record and report with events (e.g., births and deaths) in compliance with Goldredo Statutes, Board of Health Regulations, and Office of the State Registrar of Vital Statistics policies. Public Health Directors shall set as the local registrar of vital statistics or contract out the responsibility of registrar in the erea over which the agency has jurisdiction.

#### SLV Regional information on COVID-19 as of 1/20/22:

There are currently 589 known active cases of COVID-19 in the San Luis Valley.

- Conejos County 90
- Costilla County -80
- Mineral County 20
- Rio Grande County 115
- Saguache County 52

#### Conejos County as of 1/19/21:

- 90 active cases
- 1,319 positives confirmed to date
- 120 hospitalized to date
- 12 Outbreaks
- Current positivity rate for Conejos County is 22.05% (from 1/9-1/15/22)
   Up from 7.6% at this time last month (12/5-12/11/21) 14.45% increase
   Goal is to stay under 5%

- 49 Deaths among cases- to date
- 18 deaths Due to COVID to date
- December 2021 = 4 deaths

## COVID Vaccines, 1<sup>ct</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> Doses and/or Boosters

Below is a brief snapshot of some recent changes pertaining to the COVID-19 response:

#### Pfizer:

- COMIRNATY is the brand name for the Pfizer COVID 19 Vaccine-offered to those 16 years and over
- CCPH is able to administer both 3rd doses and Boosters
- · CCPH can administer to those 12 years of age and up
- CCPH began administering to children ages 5-11 on 11/18/2021

## Moderna:

- CCPH is able to administer to adults 18 years and older, including 3<sup>rd</sup> doses and Boosters
- No information on approval for children 17 and under

#### J&J:


 CCPH does not administer J&J. However, FDA approved Moderna as the booster for J&J recipients.

# Redistricting Commissioner's Districts – GIS Pete Magee:


- Presentation of 2010 and 2020 Census data for Conejos County.
